Big News from the St. Lawrence Lowlands

Questerre Energy's St. Edouard No. 1A horizontal well in the St. Lawrence Lowlands in Quebec flowed initial rates over 12 million cubic feet per day and sustained rates of over six million cubic feet per day during testing.

The Nicolet permit in the St. Lawrence Lowlands has an estimated 8.67 trillion cubic feet of gas in place. This permit is shared 50/50 by Junex and Canadian Quantum.
